Dear Friends in Christ,

As the weather begins its yearly chill and we leave the colors of autumn, we Christians look toward Advent and the beginning of a new Church Year. Advent begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas Day and ends on Christmas Eve (Dec 24). The word Advent means "coming" or "arrival." The focus of the season is the celebration of the birth of Jesus the Christ in his First Advent, and the anticipation of the return of Christ the King in his Second Advent. Thus, Advent is far more than simply marking an event in history. It is celebrating a truth about God, the revelation of God in Christ whereby all of creation might be reconciled to God. Scripture reading for Advent will reflect this emphasis on Christ Return, the Second Advent, including themes of accountability for faithfulness at His coming, judgment on sin, and the hope of eternal life.

In this double focus on past and future, Advent also symbolizes the spiritual journey of individuals and congregations, as they affirm that Christ has come, that He is present in the world today, and that He will come again in power. That acknowledgment provides a basis for holy living arising from a profound sense that we live "between the times" and are called to be faithful stewards of what is entrusted to us as God's people. So, as the church celebrates God's in-breaking into history in the Incarnation, and anticipates a future consummation to that history for which "all creation is groaning awaiting its redemption," it also confesses its own responsibility as a people commissioned to "love the Lord your God with all your heart" and to "love your neighbor as yourself."

The spirit of Advent is expressed well in the parable of the bridesmaids who are anxiously awaiting the coming of the Bridegroom (Matt 25:1-13). There is profound joy at the Bridegroom's expected coming. And yet a warning of the need for preparation echoes through the parable. But even then, the prayer of Advent is still:

Come, O Come, Emmanuel,

And ransom captive Israel!

May you have a blessed Advent and a Holy Christmas! Fr. Mike+


### St. James Website Coming Soon



Sunday, December 3, marks the beginning of a season which has been the source of uncounted musical gifts: Advent, Christmas, Epiphany. To celebrate this yearly event the Chancel Choiir will sing an introit and offertory anthem each Sunday in December. We hope our musical offerings will enrich your experience of Advent/Christmas, 2017.

Christmas is not the time period surrounding December 25th, but rather one of three distinct events that celebrate God becoming one of us in Jesus, the Incarnation. During Advent, we focus on the excitement, wonder, and expectation of what is to come. During the Christmas season, we celebrate the Incarnation and try to live fully as God wills by pouring out our lives for others. Christmas is NOT over on December 26th; instead, it is a season of 12 days culminating at the Epiphany and the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, where Christ becomes manifest (present) to all peoples. On Epiphany, we focus on the three Wise Men, symbolizing the many races for whom Christ was born. The baptism of Jesus marks the beginning of his public ministry. In order to truly celebrate God's "Christmas gift" to us (the Incarnation), the entire season from Advent through Epiphany should be upheld in our actions and in our hearts.



#### From the Choir


