



Outreach House Facts & Figures:

Due to COVID-19 the Outreach House is now serving clients and the general population weekly via Tuesday afternoon carlines. This has been widely utilized and continues to feed the hungry and clothe the naked.

New Member Ministry Commission focuses on welcoming new members and helping them integrate into the St James church community.



What have we accomplished?



A new construction 2500 square foot modernized building to house the growing ministry of the Outreach House. This building will allow us to minister to those in need in our Collegeville/Lower Providence Township community.



HVAC Replacement A long-overdue replacement of the HVAC equipment in the current sanctuary building. The new system will reduce utility cost and provide reliable operation for years to come.





Completed!

An upgrade to the electrical system in the current sanctuary building. The replacement of outdated electrical circuit breaker panels throughout the building. Adding grounded utility electrical outlets to the outer part of the building to be used by property maintenance workers.



Outreach House Construction Timeline

Site Work – Feb. 2019 included:

 Site excavation - tree clearing- storm water drainage system installation - building pad preparation

Construction – March/April 2019 included:

- Footings foundation wall utility access piping
- Exterior walls framed and sheathed
- Roofing completed
- Windows installed custom exterior doors on order
- Concrete poured interior flooring & exterior porch areas
- Interior Walls walls framed
- Utilities rough wiring & plumbing completed





Outreach House Construction Timeline (cont.)

Construction:

- Exterior: wall covering installation utility connections curbing, sidewalks & parking installation planting/seeding
- Interior: dry wall installation electrical, plumbing, HVAC installation finish work (tile, paint, trim)
