
Iva Ferrell

Iva Johnson Ferrell is the proud mother of two sons, Evan and Ian. She and her family have been members of the St. James Community for several years. Iva was born and raised in Central New Jersey. She currently co-teaches the Middle and High School class in the Church School.

Presently, Iva is an Associate Professor at the Delaware Law School and also serves as Co-Director of the Trial Admissions Program there. She previously served as the Chief Diversity Officer of Widener University. She Professor Ferrell received a B.A. in Economics from the University of Delaware; a Master of Business Administration in Marketing from Rutgers Graduate School of Management; and a J.D. from the University of Pittsburgh School of Law. After graduating law school Professor Ferrell was employed as associate attorney at Pepper Hamilton LLP in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, where she focused on software licensing, intellectual property, and commercial litigation. As an associate attorney at Morgan, Lewis & Bockius LLC in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, Professor Ferrell's practice area focused on contract drafting, including licensing, co-branding, and other business agreements. Most recently, prior to joining Widener, Professor Ferrell was employed as associate counsel for QVC, Inc. in West Chester, Pennsylvania.

External to the University, Professor Ferrell serves as Chair of the Advisory Board of the Chester Corps of the Salvation Army and is a Member of Board of Advisors for the Montgomery County OIC. She is also on the Executive Committee of the University of Delaware HenLaw Society. Professor Ferrell is President of the Southeastern Pennsylvania Chapter of the Drifters, a Golden Life member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated, and Protocol Chair for the Philadelphia Chapter of Jack and Jill of America, Inc.



Total Outreach \$104,232





- The 2020 Annual audit will begin when the 2019 audit is complete.




Total Assets Status



Parish Life & Member Ministry


Although many wonderful activities and events had to be put on pause, Parish Life began a phone tree to reach out to our Parishioners and check in on them.

- Covid-19 Procedures & Protocols: We created a document to help our parishioners understand how we are creating a safe environment and how to proceed when they visit our building.
- YouTube: Due to the pandemic we began to offer our services via YouTube and increased our subscriptions by 161 in 2020. We then began to offer Compline with Deacon Lou and special services throughout the year.
- Social Media: We continue to enhance our Social Media presence, particularly via Facebook and have seen growth as a direct result.
- Happenings: Using Flocknote we distribute a weekly email called *Happenings* and can disseminate timesensitive information quickly
- Forms: Ask all committees utilize the forms available. Communication Request Forms should be used for advertising events/meetings; Building Use Forms are available to request space at St. James'; Request for Repair forms are available to bring attention to repairs needed. 

HVAC Replacement A long-overdue replacement of the HVAC equipment in the current sanctuary building. The new system will reduce utility cost and provide reliable operation for years to come.

An upgrade to the electrical system in the current sanctuary building. The replacement of outdated electrical circuit breaker panels throughout the building. Adding grounded utility electrical outlets to the outer part of the building to be used by property maintenance workers.
